OIntroduction

The Bangkok School of Tropical Medicine offers the international Graduate Diploma in Biomedical and Health Informatics (BMHI) program every year. The program is taught in the English language and is open to students of all nationalities. It starts in the first week of January each year.

Philosophy

This interdisciplinary program trains graduates to apply information technology for the special needs of healthcare and public health. Biomedical informatics is concerned with issues right across the health spectrum, from the personal to the global, ranging from medical records for individual patients, to sharing data about disease outbreaks among government and international health organizations.

Objectives

Graduates from this program will be able to:

- 1) Apply skills and demonstrate knowledge of information systems in healthcare practices;
- 2) **C**reate and implement strategy, and provide direction for public health informatics;
- 3) **U**ses informatics to integrate clinical health, environmental risk, and population health;
- 4) Ensure IT operations are managed effectively to support public health programs;
- 5) Take responsibility, and demonstrate qualities of integrity and self-sacrifice, for the welfare of the community.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must:

- 1) Hold an M.D., D.D.S., D.V.M., B. Pharmacy, B.N.S., or B.Sc. in biomedical science, public health, computer science, or information and communication technology with a GPA of at least 2.00.
- 2) Have proficiency in English.

Note: Exceptions to these requirements may be made by the Program Committee and the Dean of the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

Duration of Study

6 months, from January-June each year.

Tuition Fees

International Student: 4,000 USD; Thai Students: 50,400 Baht
