


Personal experience of botfly myiasis. (unreported)


In 2009 a British Bhikkuni (Female Buddhist monk) who residenced in South America, was sent from infection disease specialist for REMOVE MAGGOT.

In 23 June,2010.A 33 years old Thai male who is a cameraman, just came back from Brazil on 11 June,2010 with an insect bite lesion at left forearm.










His colleagues (5 members), 42 years old Thai male has a similar lesion at left arm.
