BEIJING ISSUES NEW RULES FOR DAIRY INDUSTRY

Measures will attempt to monitor and supervise the unregulated supply chain

China's State Council issued new regulations to tighten quality control of the dairy industry in the wake of the tainted-milk crisis, state media said yesterday, as a second lawsuit was filed by parents of a sickened baby.

Contaminated milk powder, laced with the chemical melamine, has been blamed for causing the deaths of four infants and sickening more than 54,000 others. More than 10,000 children were admitted to hospitals, the Health Ministry said.

The wave of new measures is part of China's attempt to establish monitoring and supervision over its dairy industry, where a largely unregulated supply chain has flourished.

The news came as Zhang Xiwen, a migrant worker from southern Guangdong province, filed a legal claim after his 11-month-old son was diagnosed with kidney stones, his lawyer Chen Beiyuan said. The baby had been fed formula produced by the Sanlu Group since his birth.

The Guangzhou Intermediate People's Court has yet to accept the lawsuit, which is seeking US\$132,000 (Bt4.54 million) in compensation, Chen said.

AT A GLANCE

■ Effective immediately, the regulations tighten control over how cows are bred, how raw milk is purchased and the production and sale of dairy products.

■ The measures prescribe punishment for people who violate safety standards and quality-control departments that fail to fulfill duties.

MILK collection stations will now need approval from local authorities to operate. Dairy suppliers violating standards will be blacklisted and named publicly.

Violent Bangkok protests trap Parliament members

BANGKOK: In a day of street battles that left more than 100 people wounded, anti-government protesters surrounded Parliament on Tuesday, trapping hundreds of lawmakers inside throughout the afternoon.

Prime Minister Somchai Wongsawat escaped over a back fence in the morn-

ing after delivering a policy address. But other members were unable to leave for more than five hours, when the police dispersed the massed protesters with volleys of tear gas and cleared the way for them.

The Thai military announced that it would deploy unarmed troops to help the police keep peace in the days to come.

"We ran, ran, ran," said one Parliament member, Niyom Vejkarma, who had stripped off his jacket and tie and fled from the building in his patent leather shoes.

"My eyes are sore," he said, referring to the tear gas that lingered in the air as he and fellow lawmakers stood at a street corner with their cellphones and called their drivers.

The assault on Parliament escalated a six-week sit-in on the grounds of the prime ministers office, a kilometer away, that had forced the government to relocate its business to a former international airport.

The assault and street battles appeared to have been well planned and well supplied. Protesters distributed food, water and masks to protect against tear gas.

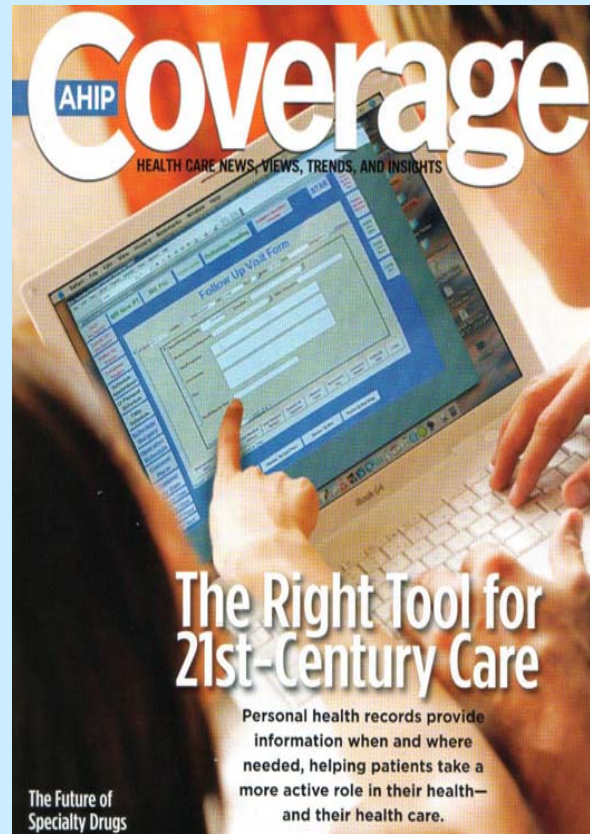
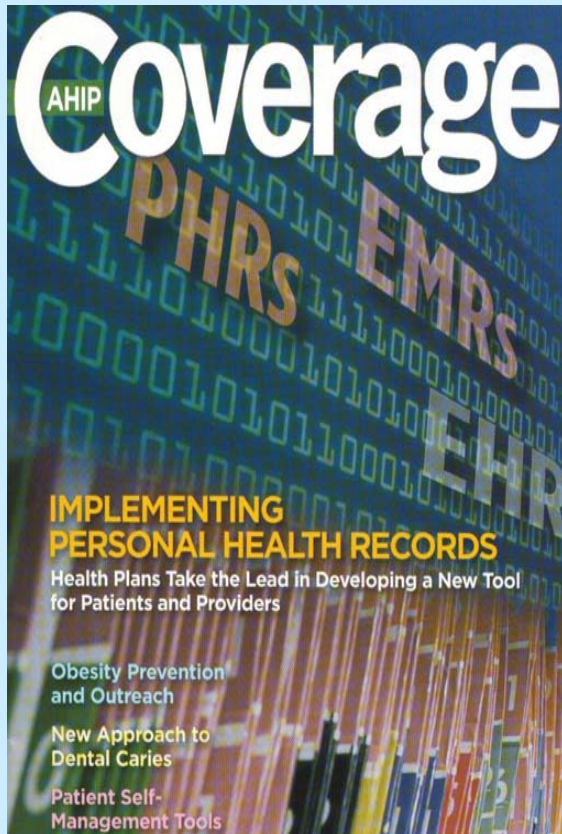
Las Vegas — Microsoft Corp chairman Bill Gates took the wraps off its next-generation operating system known as Windows Vista on Wednesday, displaying features aimed at positioning the software giant as the entertainment hub for a future of digitally connected homes.

THE ONCE-FRUSTRATING process of sharing digital photos and videos has been noticeably improved over the past year, thanks to seamless Web-based programs that work like desktop applications. But most of these sites give all the sharing power to whoever created the album, leaving invited guests to simply look at photos or add comments.

I uploaded more than 60 high-resolution digital photos into my first shwup album, noting that the only limitation on files is that no individual file can be larger than 100 megabytes. These images can come from your computer, Flickr, Facebook or any Web site. Out of curiosity, I plugged www.cnn.com into the Web site entry box, and shwup automatically grabbed images from the site that were available for me to use. I checked two of the images, and they were added to my album in seconds.

Shwup automatically made and added three muvees to my album, using my photos put to music with dramatically timed transitions. The short clips looked well-done, and were labeled "sample muvees" to avoid being confused with my content.

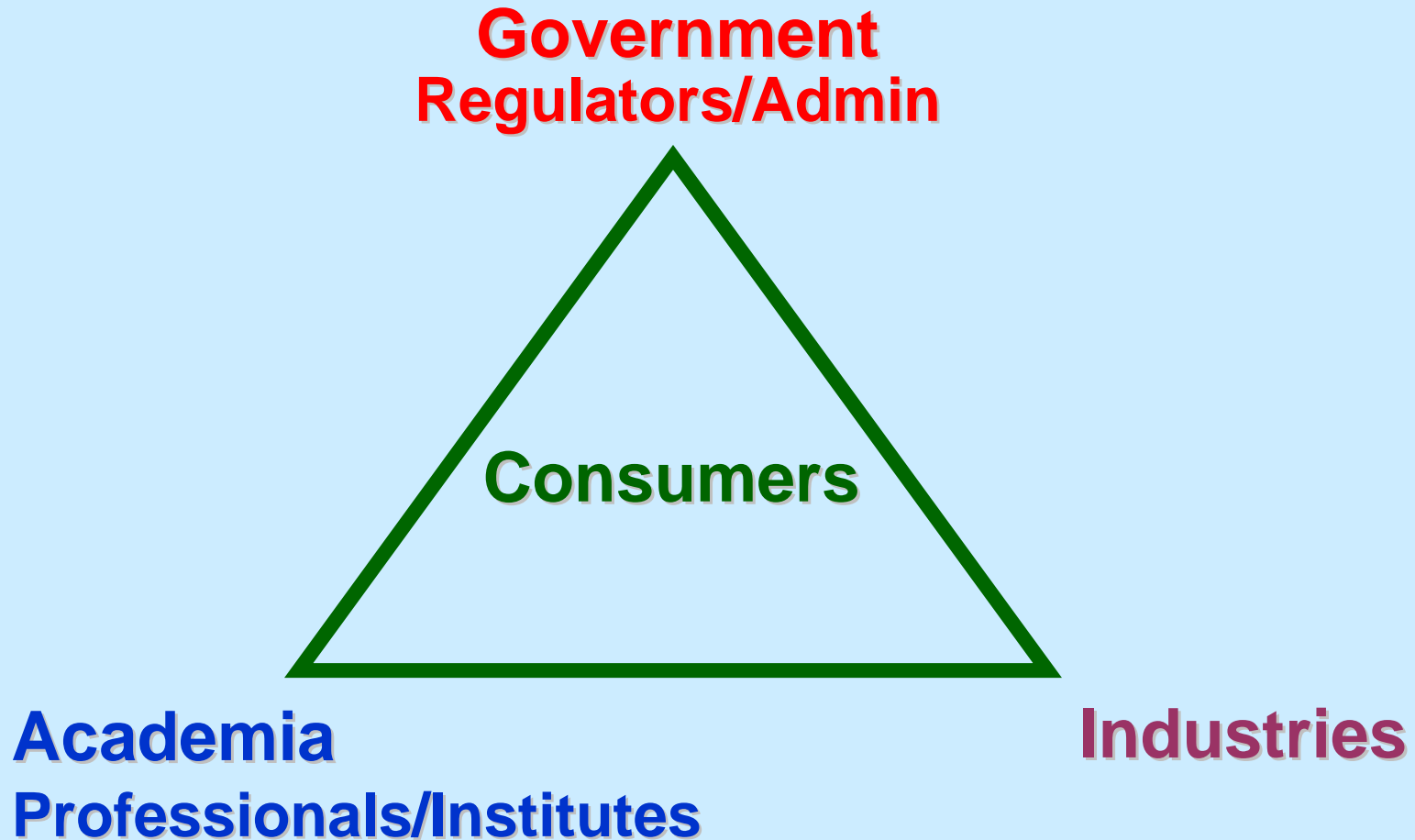
