Dr. Denise Celine Reynolds became a resident of Thailand and joined SEAMEO-TROPMED as the Technical Assistant to Professor Dr. Chamlong Harinasuta, the Coordinator of SEAMEO-TROPMED Project in 1968, responsible for the publication activities of SEAMEO-TROPMED.

Dr. Denise, as she was known to friends and collegues in Thailand and all over the world, was born and raised in Burma where she studied and obtained her M.B.B.S. Degree.
