TROPICAL DISEASES A-Z





Amoebiasis

Entamoeba histolytica, a single celled protozoa found throughout the world, especially in tropical countries.

How it is contracted Contracted by consuming contaminated food or water, including unclean enemas. It may pass into the blood stream, lymph system and from abcesses, such as in the liver. Symptoms Abdominal pain, blood or mucus in the stool. Constipation and

diarrhea. The parasite may be seen in the stool on exam Prevention Consume only clean food and water.



Bacillary dysentery

How it is contracted Consuming food or water contaminated with the bacteria, such as food prepared by a carrier of the bacteria.

Symptoms Fever, blood or mucus in the stool, diarrhea and abdominal cramps.

Prevention Consume only food that is freshy made. Wash hands after going to the toilet and before eating or drinking.



How it is contracted From the bite of female Aedes aegypti or Aedes albopictus mosquitoes which have the virus from a previous blood meal. Some mosquitoes bite outside and others bite inside the home.

Symptoms Fever, joint pain, body aches.

Prevention Eliminate breeding sites for mosquitoes, such as standing water.



How it is contracted From the bite of female Aedes aegypti or Aedes albopictus contracted mosquitoes which have the virus from a previous blood meal.

Symptoms Fever, headache, body aches, nausea, vomiting, sometimes rash and in more severe cases bleeding, shock and death.

Prevention Eliminate bleeding sites for mosquitoes, such as standing water.



In Asia, from the microfilaria of the parasites Brugia malayi and

Wuchereria bancrofti. How it is contracted From the bite of Culex or other mosquito species that have the parasite from a previous blood meal.

Symptoms Lymphadenitis, fever, swelling of legs, scrotum, feet, or breasts. Prevention Eliminate breeding sites for mosquitoes, such us standing water.



The parasite Fasciolopsis buski in the small intestine. Eggs pass out in the stool, go into the water, hatch and pass into a fresh water snail where it develops further, passes into the water and attaches to

How it is contracted Consumption of water plants. Symptoms Distended abdomen, abdominal pain, diarrhea, nausea and vomiting.

Prevention Do not eat uncooked water plants or unboiled water.



The parasite Gnathostoma spinigerum

How it is contracted From consumption of raw food, such as fish, snake or frog, which has the parasite.

Symptoms Swelling or red bunps on the skin with itching and sometimes pain. Prevention Avoid consuming raw food.




Hookworm infection

The parasites Ancylostoma duodenale and Necator americanus.

How it is contracted The eggs pass out into the stool, hatch, then the parasite penetrates the skin and migrates to the small intestine.

Symptoms Easily tired, pale, blood lost to the parasite in the intestine.

Prevention Wear shoes.



Isosporiasis

From the parasite Isospora belli. How it is contracted From consuming food or drink contaminated by the stool of a carrier of this parsasite.

Symptoms In those with immune problems can cause chronic diarrhea and

even death.

Consume cooked food and clean water. Wash hands well before eating and after using the toilet.



From the Japanese encephalitis (JE) virus

How it is contracted Spread by the bite of the Culex mosquito, especially C.tritaeniorhynchus. Pigs are often reservoirs for the JE virus. The virus is frequently found in northwestern Thailand.

Symptoms Fever, vomiting, headache, muscle spasticity, loss of consciousness, even death.

Prevention Eliminate breeding sites for mosquitoes, especially standing water.



Kala-Azar (Visceral leishmaniasis)

From the protozoa Leismania, such as L. braziliensis.

How it is contracted From the bite of the Phlebotomus sandfly that has been infeeted; more often seen in the Middle East.

Symptoms Sores on skin, hepato- or spleno-megaly, anemia, fatigue, leukopenia and death.

Prevention Avoid bites of the Sandfly by wearing long pants and long sleeves and using insect repellant



Leptospirosis

Cause From the bacteria Leptospira spp.

How it is contracted The bacteria enters through sores in the skin or from prolonged exposure to water contaminated with infected rat urine.

Symptoms Fever, chills, body aches, jaundice, easy bleeding, liver and kidney

Prevention Avoid exposure to contaminated water, wear shoes, wear gloves when coming into contact with rat urine



Malaria

From the protozoa parasite Plasmodia, such as P. falciparum or P. vivax. How it is contracted From the bite of female Anopheles spp. mosquitoes, such as An.dirus, that have the parasite.

Symptoms Fever, headache, nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, and death due to complications, such as cerebral malaria, renal failure, liver failure and pulmonary edema.

Prevention Avoid mosquito bites, wear long sleeves, use mosquito repellent, use a mosquito net.



Cause From the amoeba Negleria fowleri

How it is contracted By aspirating water contaminated with the amoeba,

which may enter the nose. It more often affects children. Symptoms Fever, nausea, vomiting, headache, meningitis, coma and death.

Prevention Swim in clean water, avoid aspirating unclean water.



From the parasite Opisthorchis viverrini.

How it is contracted From eating raw fish contaminated with the developing parasite metacercaria.

Symptoms Distended abdomen, especially the epigastrium and right upper abdomen, hepatomegaly, hepatic insufficiency, cancer of the common bile duct or liver cancer.

Prevention Eat only cooked fish.



From the parasite Paragonimus heterotaemus

How it is contracted By eating raw crab or shrimp that is infected with the

Symptoms Chronic cough, sputum, rust colored or blood tinged sputum.

Prevention Eat only cooked crab or shrimp.



How it is contracted A tick is the vecter, it may be found in goat meat or milk of goats, cows or buffalo that have the bacteria C. burnetii

Symptoms Fever, chills, headache, body aches, fatigue, sore throat, nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea, chest pain and pneumonia. The bacteria may infect the lungs, heart, kidneys and may cause death.

Prevention Avoid tick bites, keep the house clean, avoid non-pasteurized milk.



The rabies virus.

How it is contracted It is a central nervous system disorder with the virus found in

saliva of mammals. Is is spread by the bite of, or contamination with, the saliva of an infected animal, which spreads through the nerves to the brain. Symptoms Brain infection, confusion, nausea, spasms, weakness, inability to swallow, death in all cases.

Prevention Avoid exposure to the saliva of a contaminated animal. Prevent with



Scrub typhus

From the bacteria Rickettsia, specifically Orientia tsutsugamushi. How it is contracted The vector is a young tick, that feeds on the blood of animals. If bitten by an infected tick it will cause a sore similar to a small burn on the skin.


Symptoms Fever, headache, lymphadenopathy, heart or lung disease and Prevention Avoid the bite of the tick, keep pets and house clean.

Typhoid Cause From the bacteria Samonella typhi.

How it is contracted From consuming food contaminated with the bacteria.

Symptoms Fever, chills, lethargy, abdominal pain, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or constipation; complications include bleeding from the gastrointestinal tract and perforation.

Prevention Eat only well cooked food and drink clean water.



Undulant fever

From the bacteria Brucella spread from animals, such as cows, buffalo, pigs, cats and dogs.

How it is contracted Eating food contaminated with the bacteria, drinking contaminated milk from goats, cows. Symptoms Vomiting, diarrhea, chronic fever for months, muscle weakness,

joint pains, weight loss Prevention Eat only clean food, avoid non-pasteurized milk, wash hands after



The bacteria Vibrio cholerae which has many types, such as El Tor Cause or 0139.

How it is contracted The bacteria is in the stool or vomitus of those infected. This can then comtaminate food or water or can be spread by flies. Symptoms Profuse waterly, diarrhea causing dehydration and electrolyte abnormalities severe enough to cause death.

Prevention Wash hands well before eating and prevent food from being





West Nile fever

Cause How it is contracted The reservoirs are birds, such as wild birds or crows, and is

spread to humans by the culex mosquito; seen in America. Symptoms Fever, headache, body aches, lymphadenitis, rash and encephalitis

Prevention Avoid mosquito bites, use a mosquito net, wear long sleeves.

Remove mosquito breeding places.





Xerophthalmia Vitamin A deficiency

Cause Deficiency of vitamin A.

Symptoms Color blindness at night, dry conjunctiva, eye ulcers, dry cornea,

Prevention Eat food that has vitamin A, such as egg yolks, milk, yellow fruits or vegetables and morning glory.
